Organ Committee visits Lima Pipe Organ

Several members of the Organ Committee recently visited the Lima Pipe Organ Company to view the progress of our Noehren Pipe Organ. All of the pipes have been removed from the sanctuary and are going through extensive renovation, restoration, reconstruction, and repair at the Lima Pipe Organ shop. We were able to see the progress of the repairs as well as new construction of the base the pipes that will be reinstalled in the organ chamber.

It was amazing to see the number of pipes (over 2000 total, from the size of your little finger to 16' in length!). They all need to work in harmony with each other to produce the many sounds and timbres this magnificent instrument will create. Once they are brought back to the church, you will notice an entirely different look as some of the pipes will be revealed and extend out over the choir loft. This will obviously change, and we think enhance the sound of the instrument.

We were able to witness some of the pipes which have become damaged over the years of use. They will all be reshaped and eventually polished and tuned to once again enhance the sound and appearance of the front of the church. It has been 45 years since the organ was originally built and installed. This is the first major renovation since that time.
